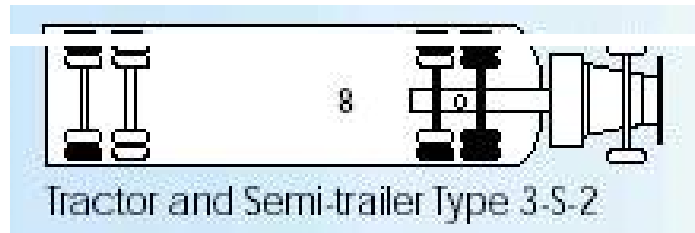


Chain Requirements by State

PT Minimum chain quantity is 8 chains



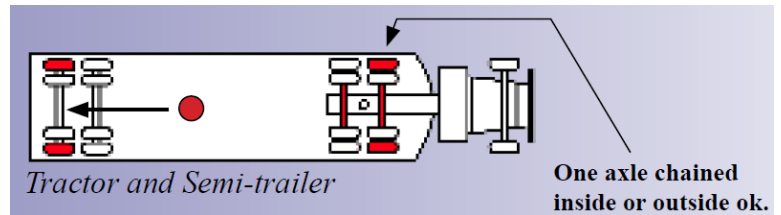
California (8 chains) – No dates

Colorado – 4 drive tires (4 chains) Sept 1 – May 31

See Oregon

Idaho – No min requirement

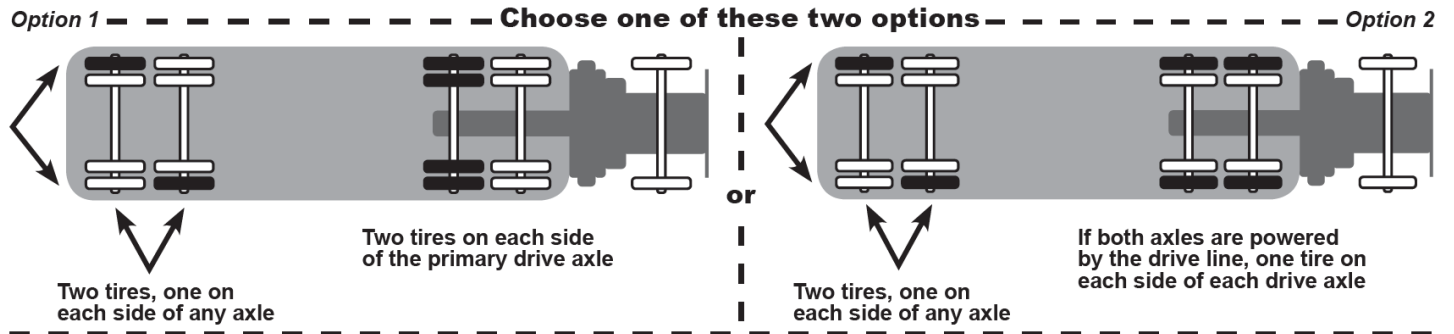
Montana – Not mandatory unless notices posted (Oct 1-May 1)



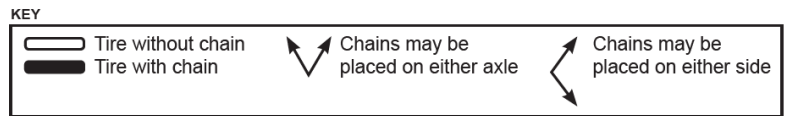
Nevada (4 chains) No dates

New Mexico – No min requirement No dates

Oregon – Required when SNOW ZONE signs are posted

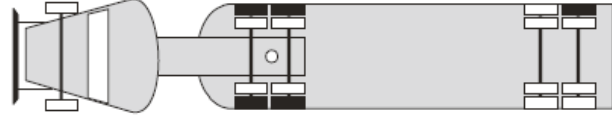

South Dakota – No min requirement No dates

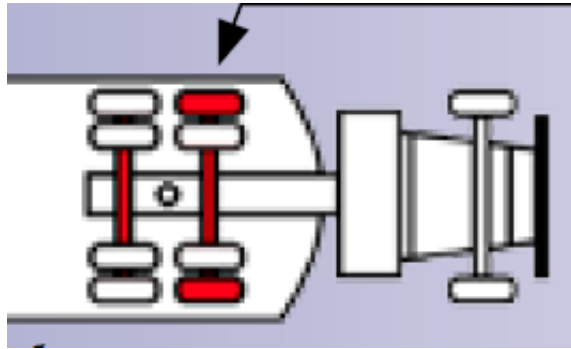
Utah – No Min requirement (Nov 1 – March 31)



All tires on one drive axle or one tire on each side of both drive axles. One tire on either side of either trailer axle. This includes Automobile Transporters.

Washington (5 chains) (Nov 1 – March 31)

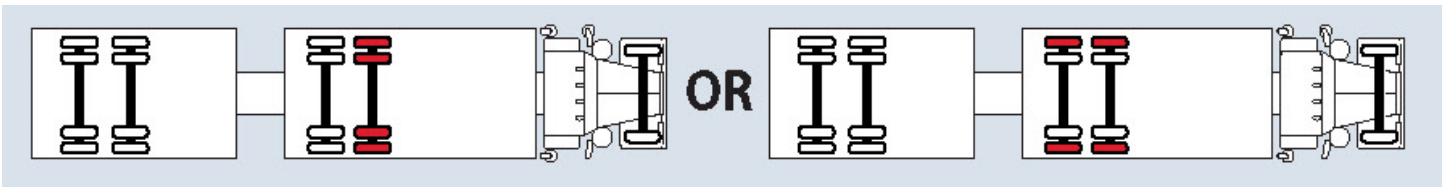
Wyoming – At Level 2: Chains on at least 2 of the drive wheels at opposite ends of the same drive axle No dates

BC – 4 drive tires (4 chains) or 6 drive tires (6 chains) for LCV
